"Jesus wept." St. John 11:35

Isn't it interesting that the shortest verse in the Bible deals with devastation? There has been a lot of weeping during this challenging pandemic season, and rightfully so. But life goes on and thus, many families and friends, ours and yours, are experiencing bereavement and sadness as we wait for a change to come. Even hearing about and watching the many heartbreaking stories and tragic events bring tears to our eyes.
